


Paul and Lesley Evans Christmas News 2023

Paul's cancer scans continue to show that he remains cancer free, and he keeps active in his outdoor gym – an allotment. Another perk is that we get a supply of veg and fruit from his efforts. He is now busy digging and weeding to prepare the ground for winter and next season.
